3. PROGRAM BACKGROUND, RATIONALE AND INDICATIVE CONTENTS 3.1 Program Description And Objectives

Based on the SIAS needs assessment and skill gaps survey, the purpose of this postgraduate MSc in Resilience Economy program was set to create experts in the field

of resilience economy, socioeconomic tolerance experts, Conflicts problem solvers with socioeconomic backgrounds, community development experts, social innovation entrepreneurs, resilience engineers, community coexistence planners, and many other potential roles related to resilience, tolerance, coexistence and the economic development or stability. Besides, this program targets to create multidisciplinary holistic thinkers that would use the model shown in Figure (1) through lifelong learning practices to build the resilience of economists mindsets, which can spot challenges or crises ahead and turn them into opportunities and thus create more independent, resilient communities.

The program combines the concepts of Resilience with Inspiration/Youth/Aging and Future Foresight Economies, in the modules and the courses' Intended Learning Outcome to build the "Resilient Economy" leadership. Along with research and development done before, during and after the 'Field Projects' the program graduates are expected to inspire their communities and organisations in the techniques and approaches of resilience that are going to bring a clear positive outcome. This program is unique, since it would produce graduates that competent to be: Resilience Leaders, Socio-Economy Experts, Change Facilitators, Conflict and Complexity Problem Solvers, Social Innovators and similar titles that are highly needed by all the communities in the world that need more competency of risks mitigation and communities stability experts.

This extensive program shows a good connection with the reality of the business world and ensures the best interaction between students, lecturers, and professionals in a spirit of participative learning and teamwork. The case studies and deep dialogue techniques would be up-to-date, which shall help to develop new insights for business owners and future economy leaders. The program graduates would not only be expected to have high employability possibilities, but even be a source for creating socio-economy influencers.

The program would address the great shortage of experts relevant to the United Nations Sustain Development Goals (UN-SDGs) Experts, especially in issues as poverty, youth, unemployment, migration, women, child labour, families' instabilities, etc.

The case studies and the deep dialogue embedded in the program courses will be up-todate and will help the students to develop new insights for social business and to be future socioeconomic leaders. Not only are program graduates expected to have high employment potential, but to be in any or all the new fields of the economy as sharingeconomy, collaborative-economy, behavioural-economy and inspiration-economy. All these economies have great influences on socioeconomic development, especially in developing countries.

3.2 Differentiation of (MSc Resilience Economy) & its Role in Socioeconomic Development of Rwanda, Africa & the World

Still today, most Socioeconomic Issues are dealt with as complicated chronic problems (i.e., it needs time and financial resources). However, in reality, most of the existing world problems that could not be solved, i.e., poverty, migration, etc., are complex rather than complicated. Clearly, there is a gap in the capacity of the world graduates of today to address


the world's "complexity", specifically in dealing with the "complex problems" in relevance to socioeconomic issues. Dealing with the complexity of current and future world problems requires holistic multidisciplinary thinking, approaches and an empathetically driven mindset. Therefore, the MSc in Resilience Economy (called in short here MRE) which is from the proposed SIAS tries to bring graduates that address this gap instead of going towards the current sub-speciality postgraduate studies that the capital-based economy created in our life. This style of creating multidisciplinary expert problem solvers, help to overcome the necessity of bringing more abundant mindset graduates rather than closed scarcity mindset graduates that classical programs are helping to create.

As the world is going through devastating pandemic spillovers that influenced both our life and livelihood, more spillovers are expected in every sector and discipline. The COVID-19 and the lockdowns for more than 24 months brought challenges, but also opportunities. However, unfortunately, most of the opportunities have gone towards technology relation solutions rather than human-related solutions. The international emergency, the polarisation within regions and the world, and the stretch between the leftist and rightist movements have created a shakeup for what we used to know before the outbreak of the virus. Now, globalisation is reviewed, and a transformation of new economic powers in many communities, including their socioeconomic situations, are all going through periods of instability and deterioration of quality of life; despite the availability of many resources and sources for development.

Observing, absorbing, and then realising the new global reality, in both the developed and under-developed countries bring new perspectives to any new initiative, especially if this initiative comes to create a realised socioeconomic differentiation between the communities throughout the world. The increase in the gap between the poor and the rich, and the failure to achieve the top Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as the elimination of poverty in 2025, means the world needs a new mindset and new approaches to the dominating capital-based economy. Therefore, the SIAS initiated where the programs offered would focus on the type of formulas used to deal with today and future problems. The MSc in Resilience Economy is one of them.

Issues such as non-communicable diseases, migration, the gap between the poor and the rich, middle-class rigidity, unemployment, family instability, scarce job opportunities, vulnerable people's needs, growing population, intergeneration gaps, etc., are just a few of the rapidly increasing socioeconomic problems. In this repeated world crisis that is both man-made and natural, the need for a well-structured approach to address world problems from specific niches is highly in demand. In the international inspiration economy project (IIEP) we found this gap is clear when it comes to preparing a generation of leaders that are considered like socioeconomic physicians who can properly diagnose the contemporary diseases within the communities and give the proper treatment efficiently and effectively. This means setting up an academic institute that brings postgraduates and encourages research that would see problems as opportunities for development.

Therefore, SIAS sees a silver lining in this world situation. While most of the world is worried about the rising mental health problems, along with rising communities' frictions, and more displacement of people due to wars, hunger, and drought, which led to more scarce-driven mindsets, we see opportunities for calibrating the path through the making of future socioeconomic leaders that overcome conflicts and bring in more solutions to these complicated problems. Therefore, and based on the intention of preserving or enhancing those work on the formula of (capacity vs demand) rather than (supply vs demand), the SIAS programs, comes to offer more structured approaches, through its field-structured PhD, or MSc programs that create different type of projects that impact that the world needs today and the future, even before graduation.

The SIAS programs promise to ignite positive change in the communities, starting from the developing countries, which would help to overcome the negativity of world conflicts, disasters and crises towards more inspiring experiences, models and stories that could be built starting from Rwanda, Africa and Developing countries.

3.2.1. Skills Development

Through teaching, research, and community service, we train students in order to be competitive at the national and regional levels. The Program features the following areas:

- In-depth knowledge of Resilience Economy theories, practices, methodologies, processes and tools.
- The mindset and the competency needed to successfully carry out Resilience labs development projects across organization and communities fields.
- The capacity to use Resilience economy approaches in solving complex problems and developing corporate and public institutional strategies.
- Mastering of the tools would create an effective socioeconomic outcome.
- The ability to communicate effectively to promote the culture of a Resilience economy, and to disseminate the practice in the public as well as the corporate spheres, by engaging with communities' issues and challenges and bringing solutions for sustainable development.
- To develop the capabilities of the students to effectively harness the practices of Resilience Economy with evidence-based higher quality intended learning designs.
- To carry out world-class research and development in line with resilience Economy strategic priorities which focus on applied research.

3.2.2. Research Facilities

Research is built at the heart of each module in the MRE program. The facilities in this program would be more dependent on the following:

- a) The Resilience Lab that comes from the targeted communities, or challenges needs
- b) The Reference Resilience Economy Tools and Books
- c) The Visualisation "Deep Dialogue' Room
- d) The Students' exploration visits

SIAS MRE program leaders would ensure that they provide proper support facilities such as ITC and computer labs, besides graduate discussion rooms. Also, all the MRE candidates would be entitled to participate in exploratory visits, and best practice visits, besides SIAS forums and conferences. The students would also have access to free publications related to their scope of study, including case studies. In certain cases, students would be encourage publishing in IIEP/SIAS journals and would be sponsored even for publishing in other high ranking journals, if their research is ready for this stage.

3.2.3. Entrepreneurial and business development

Graduates of resilience economy graduates should be able to:

- Create and manage an income-generating project.
- Besides, the resilience economy, the graduate of SIAS would focus on innovation and entrepreneurship as a means towards creating change in a community.
- Since the spirit of entrepreneurship and innovation is well covered in all the PIE and SIAS programs in general, the target would be to attract all types of entrepreneurs, but especially social entrepreneurs etc.)
- Create and manage their own businesses

3.2.4. Jobs opportunity

The quality of the graduates targeted by the SIAS programs will carry various title competencies whether they work as employees, social entrepreneurs, or specialise as community change leaders.

The following job titles or specialities, listed in Table (1) below, are expected to be one of the products of the MRE program; however, it is worth noting that the job opportunities are not limited to this list, and the graduates in this program would carry some of all these title competencies whether they work as employees or entrepreneurs. The real differentiation of the graduates of this program is their multidisciplinary background and their capacity to create a value-added contribution in approximately every field. Despite the fact that it is the top job that the MRE program would produce, the title job of 'Resilience Economy Expert' was not listed at the top since it is not known yet; however, the foresight that this job comes as high demand over the next 5 to 7 years.

Besides mentioning a sample of the type of industries, all these products (the type of jobs and graduates) of the PRE program can be self-employed. The main income would come from social-for-profit projects, consultancy, freelancing and mentoring.
