One- Brief about SIAS Infrastructure Phases

Following Article 41, of the law No 010/2021 of 16/02/2021 & the Ministerial Order No 001/MINEDUC/2021 of 20/10/2021, SIAS targets to have a two-phase infrastructure when operating in the first three years after accreditation. One would be fully ready before accreditation, the second phase would be ready within the first two years of accreditation. Then SIAS plans to grow more gradually based on the students and market demand.


The purpose of the SIAS infrastructure is to:

- Prepare socio-economist that can address the need for countries' development strategies and future foresight.
- Produce a generation of professionals endowed with the skills necessary to develop, lead and spread the culture of Inspiration Economy (including optimisation of Behavioural Economy practices).
- Bring in graduates that lead contemporary & future social-for-profit projects.
- Develop Multidisciplinary disruptive problem solvers who bring unique solutions to the world that touches human life.

The plan was first to build a Phase 2 building inside the facility acquired for the Phase 1 building that is in Buhoro Village, but taking the logical HEC recommendation, this plan was cancelled. Currently, SIAS is looking to acquire Phase 2 land in the same area as Phase 1, and which is planned to be within 5 to 10 minutes of walking distance. Phase 2 would further give SIAS more opportunities to accept more students since it would have more classes and administrative facilities.

Location of SIAS Phase One Infrastructure:

Building 16, KK19 Avenue, Buhoro Village, Niboyi Cell, Niboyi Sector, Kicukiro District, Kigali City, Rwanda.






Two- Description of the SIAS Facilities

The facility is established on a **948 sqm** piece of land purchased by **Inspiration Economy Limited** (ILE) represented by the Chairman of the board of Trustee for SIAS and the founder of ILE Dr Mohamed Buheji. The project for infrastructure rehabilitation to meet the HEC standards is supervised by the Founder with the support Dr. Donya Ahmed, who is the Managing Director of ILE and the proposed Vice Chancellor of SIAS.

The infrastructure has gone through a complete renovation to be ready to fit the purpose of a limited selective number of students in a postgraduate institute. The renovation and furnishing and distribution of the classrooms and other facilities fit the purpose of SIAS in the first three years. This has been in line with the Presidential Order N°51/01 of 13/07/2010 establishing quality standards in higher learning institutions, Official Gazette n° 32 of 09/08/2010 Year 49 n° 32 09 of August 2010, and the law No 010/2021 of 16/02/2021 determining the organization of education on matters regarding the types of Higher Learning Institutions, with special focus on Articles 69 and 70. Besides, this plan follows the Ministerial Order No 001/MINEDUC/2021 of


20/10/2021, with special focus on Articles 39, 40, and 41 which determine the standards in Education and establish infrastructures and facilities adequate for academic activities.

SIAS have set up the infrastructure and facilities that fit the intended purpose of the accredited postgraduate programs, with the appropriate mixture of lecture rooms, lecture halls, offices, and recreational area suitable for postgraduate students.

Three-SIAS Commitment for Phase 2 Expansion

Besides the available plot, SIAS founder and board of trustees have committed to expand and open another building nearby in Niboyi Cell, Niboyi Sector, Kicukiro District, within a maximum of 24 months from accreditation. This expansion would further support the facilities and services given to both SIAS students and faculty, besides opening more classrooms, conference rooms, computer labs, and a research centre. This is clearly indicated in the business and strategic plans. This expansion would start to be effective within two years after accreditation and operation once one of the following red-dotted real-estate owners agrees to sell or have a deal. The budget for Phase (2) is available.

Four-SIAS Buildings Color Theme



Phase 1 already adopted this colour theme successfully, and it is yet to be applied to Phase 2 building once purchased and renovation starts.

Five- SIAS Facilities Sizes Commitment

Taking the HEC standards besides the Ministerial Order No 001/MINEDUC/2021 of 20/10/2021 that determine how establish infrastructures and facilities adequate for SIAS academic activities, the following sizes were taken into consideration when laying

out the SIAS facility design, be it multi-purpose halls, classes, postgraduates' working rooms, library, visualisation lab, cafeteria, computer lab and other support facilities. So these facilities would be improved within the two to three years.

Six- Examples of Classrooms and Halls for Postgraduate Programs 6.1 Classrooms & Halls Designated For Masters Students

SIAS is expecting, on average, 15 MSc candidates to be taken for different timings for both Inspiration and Resilience Economy Programs for the first semester and the same for the second semester. Therefore, the Phase 1 classes and halls were designated to fit this purpose and, at the same time, meet the SIAS commitment mentioned in Table (1).

Figure (5) Shows One of Two MSc Programs Classrooms & Hall




6.2 Classrooms Designated For PhD Students

In order to meet the demands of provoking postgraduate dialogues, SIAS has established a specific room for discussion for PhD students for a group of about right students.


Figure (6) Shows Two PhD Program Classrooms

SIAS have developed tables that suite the purpose for syllabus when PhD and MSc students might take the same classes, i.e. upto 30 students.





Seven- SIAS Phase 1 Infrastrcuture Details

SIAS Phase 1 facility has been equipped and renovated to meet the 'fit for purpose' required standards for the proposed number of classrooms, multi-purpose halls, office space, washrooms, staff meeting space, coffee station, students visualization room, outside kitchen and canteen, besides the parking lot. SIAS is planning to have MOUs that support its facility for Phase 1, till Phase 2 is opened within 24 months of accreditation. SIAS already also put a small outdoor recreation games area which also would be expanded with phase 2, too, later.








Figure (7) Illustrates SIAS Facilities for the 'Ground Floor'
